JOB FUNCTION:

The Program Manager is responsible for leading and managing a portfolio of strategically focused, Authority wide projects, that support of the Authority's strategic and operational objectives. Work with Authority decision-making for priorities, support structures and resource allocation. Leads the execution, maintenance, projects' implementation, change management, and cross-functional alignment of workstreams; ensures compliance with relevant industry, state and federal regulations.

Responsible for overall coordination, status reporting, and stability of project-oriented work efforts. Establishes and implements project management processes and adheres to Authority's methodology to ensure projects are delivered on time, within budget and comply with standards.

JOB DUTIES:

- Assume primary responsibility for project leadership and communication on projects deliverables. This would
 include development and monitoring of project charters, work plans, work breakdown schedules, project
 milestone and status reports, resource plans, budgets, etc.
- This role must develop comprehensive communications strategies to ensure all appropriate team members
 and stakeholders across the Authority are abreast of project issues and status. Provide regular feedback and
 exchange of information with other project leader(s), department heads, management members, and senior
 leadership.
- Proactively identify, track and resolve issues, risks and dependencies associated with projects managed, and communicate risks and issues to project team and senior leadership. Identify and implement issue resolutions.
- Lead risk management identification and mitigation plans.
- Applies project metrics and risk management principles to identify and mitigate potential schedule impacting items
- Drives the overall progress of assigned projects towards completion, using good judgment in determining when to escalate issues to management
- Leverages understanding of product domain to support concept/new feature development efforts
