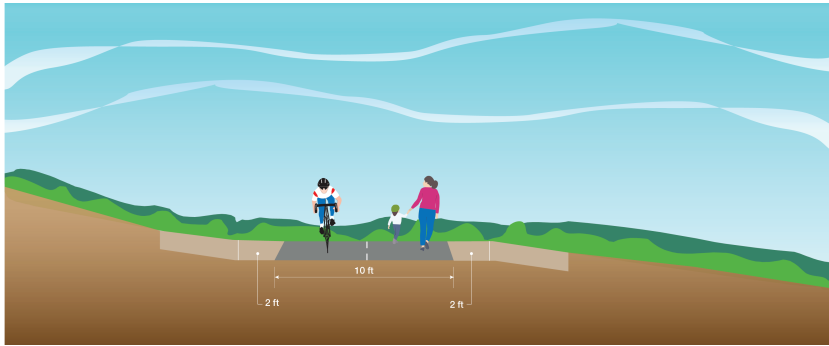


FROM THE TOLLWAY TO THE TRAILWAY

HIGH PLAINS TRAIL EXTENSION



In addition to building more capacity to keep people moving on E-470, the road widening project will also include a four-mile extension of the High Plains Trail that runs adjacent to the roadway. The trail will be extended from 26th to 64th Avenues to serve as a new north-south connection for people on foot and on bikes in Aurora and Adams County. The extension is anticipated to be complete in 2025. The goal is to eventually connect the High Plains Trail to Pena Boulevard and continue extending it further north.



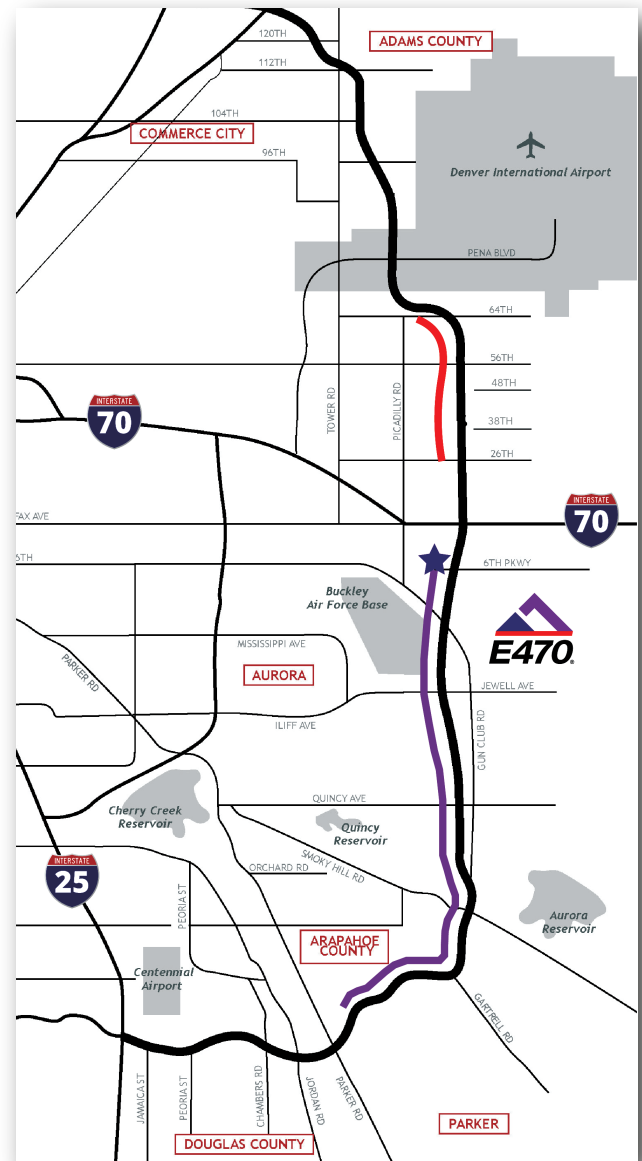
High Plains Trail Rendering

HIGHLIGHTS OF HIGH PLAINS TRAIL EXTENSION FROM 26TH TO 64TH AVENUES

- Ten-foot-wide concrete multi-use path with two-foot shoulders
- New traffic signals with pedestrian countdowns to facilitate safer crossings for people on foot and on bikes at the following interchanges:
 - 38th Avenue
 - 56th Avenue
 - 64th Avenue
